# Importance of Human Capital for Africa's Africa's Future

Africa's Demographic Dividend: 60% under the age of 25 (UN)

#### Human Capital and Economic Growth:

1% increase in a country's human capital can lead to a 0.3% increase in GDP growth


Rwanda's collaboration with Carnegie Mellon University has trained over 1000 graduates in ICT skills since 2012 Government Investments in Youth Employment and TVET


Ghana-Kenya TVET – 300,000 Youth trained annually.

The Challenge – Bridging the Skills Gap

#### **Skills Mismatch:**

There is a 52% mismatch between the skills African graduates have and what employers need (ILO).

#### **Underfunded Education Systems:**

Only **17% of African schools** have internet access, limiting students' ability to develop digital skills (UNICEF).

#### • Youth Unemployment:

Over **12 million youth** enter Africa's labor market every year, but only **3 million formal jobs** are created annually (World Bank).
